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Overdose Data to Action (OD2A) Programming

- OD2A supports collection of high quality, comprehensive, and timely data on nonfatal and fatal overdoses to inform prevention and response efforts.
- CDC launched the first RFA for OD2A in September 2019 with 66 recipients comprising of state, territorial, county, and city health departments.
- IDOH was funded for the second iteration of this grant from September 2023-August 2028 titled OD2A in States.

Syringe Service Programs

- IDOH's Harm Reduction Program is housed within the Division of HIV, STI, Viral Hepatitis
- 8 Indiana counties approved to provide syringe services
- Offer wraparound services:
 - HIV, STI, TB, and Hepatitis B & C testing,
 - Referrals to substance use and mental health care, health care, housing, food, etc.
 - Adult immunizations
 - Wound Care



Syringe Service Programs

- More than 22,900 registered participants in Indiana SSPs since 2015.
- More than 125,960 unique opportunities to connect participants to care.
- 8,200 active participants in the past year (as of June 2024).
- Syringes are returned at an average rate of 83% statewide.

The top 3 most common referrals to services at SSP locations:

- Safer Use Education
- Substance Use Disorder Treatment
- HIV Testing
