



Approaches

- Community-based recovery is different in different environments
- To truly be effective, service providers must provide culturally appropriate services for their area
- To add complexity, even within the Black community, there are wild variations in approach and method
- The good news is that there is an existing network of experienced providers who know how to do the work

- We served adults 18 and older who have co-occurring SUD/MH
- Established through the passion of Dr. Mary
 Roberson a person in long term recovery who saw
 the need among big box treatment providers with
 minimum recovery support services.

- iHOPE offers peer recovery training services, including information and linkage to becoming a Certified Peer Specialist-Addictive Disease.
- Formed by Tarusa Stewart in 2016
- Peer2Peer Transportation service connects people in recovery to a certified recovery coach who can take them to work, run errands, and more.
- Family Preservation Prevention Service aims to increase positive outcomes for families by providing coordination of services, training, education, and peer support services to assist parents and families in achieving long-term recovery and preventing future DFCS intervention.
- Parental advocacy for developing their own selfdirected care plans and advance directives to strengthen their parenting skills and manage their own recovery

- Founded in 2005 by **Andre Johnson**, Detroit Recovery Project, Inc. (DRP) has pioneered substance abuse prevention, treatment, and recovery. Over the years, DRP has expanded its services to address the myriad of needs that exist for the underserved population of the City of Detroit that struggles with addiction, behavioral health, and lack of access to primary health care. DRP is funded through SAMHSA, BJA, Centers for Disease Control, HRSA, the State of Michigan, Detroit-Wayne Integrated Health Network (DWIHN), and other private and corporate entities.
- DRP is now a Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) that
 offers SUD/OUD treatment, recovery, behavioral health, and primary
 health care services. DRP has now expanded to provide Harm Reduction
 services, including street outreach, syringe service programming, HIV/AIDS
 and HCV testing, treatment, and linkage to care.
- DRP prides itself on maintaining a staff that is composed of individuals that represent the community served, therefore, able to offer innovative, "on-time" interventions that impact the community in tangible ways.
