









Retention for Completion






2024 Fall Career Fair

Employer Survey Results:

- 97% of Employers said BSU Candidates Met or Exceeded expectations
- 94% of Employers shared that BSU candidates clearly communicated command of Career & Self
 Development skills
- 93% of Employers shared that candidates clearly demonstrated their Communications Skills
- 91% of Employers shared that candidates clearly demonstrated their experiences with Technology
- 56% of Employers shared that BSU Candidates are Better or Much Better compared to candidates from other colleges and universities




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Enhancing Indiana Businesses

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Building Talent Pipelines


- Support work-based high school experiences

ENROLLMENT

- Enrollment remains stable after years of significant decline
 - 5,179 students in grades PreK-12 (2024-25 projection)
- Pre-K enrollment has increased 378% since 2018
 - > 239 students now enrolled in high quality pre-K
- Project Lead The Way (PLTW):
 - Participation up more than 200% at MCHS since 2018
 - All 1st-8th grade students now have PLTW built into schedules
- MCS 2024 summer programs attracted 1,650 students











Percentage of students passing IREAD3 since implementing Amplify CKLA curriculum:



- Offers automatic admission to Ball State for MCHS students meeting certain criteria:
 - ➤ 3.0 GPA
 - On-track for Core 40 diploma
- No application process
- Approximately 105 students currently meeting criteria






FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE

- Dramatic improvement in district finances
- \$31.4M cash balance:
 - > \$12.7M Education Surplus Fund
 - ⋟ \$6.2M "Rainy Day" Fund
 - > \$12.5M Other funds
- Teacher pay up 40% in 5 years
 - Starting salaries increased from \$34,659 to \$51,500

- Provide an environment which will entice more Ball State students to remain in Muncie after graduation









Support an across the board inflationary adjustment before administering the funding formula




State Operating Appropriations

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Annual Percentage Increase in Resident Undergraduate Tuition and Mandatory Fees




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Longest sustained period of low tuition growth since WWII



Cumulative Tuition & Mandatory Fee Change 2014-15 to 2024-25 Indiana Public Institutions






Average Net Price of Attendance



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

LINE ITEM FUNDING



Principal Line Item Request: Helping Indiana Thrive - \$1.5 million

- Meaningful engagement with Indiana employers, and communities, leading to increased graduate retention upon graduation tailored to meet state and local needs
- County Ambassadors Program increased statewide engagement and training for Ambassadors
- Facilitating strategic faculty engagement with employers and regions to support projects and talent pipelines
- Mentoring Programs Increase coordination with communities and industries throughout the state




Principal Capital Request: Bracken Learning Commons - \$88.42 million

- Address the changing needs of a campus library by providing centrally located Student Academic Support functions through a newly created Academic Learning Commons.
 - Reconfigure Level 1 to achieve an Academic Learning Commons.
 - Reconfigure Lower Level with added compact shelving storage systems.
- Minor renovation improvements on Levels 2, 3, and 4.
- Restroom upgrades and replacement on all five levels.
- Updates to the building's original and inefficient mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems. System upgrades will cut annual energy costs by 59%.
