2024 FILING FEES BY CASE TYPE - UPDATES

54 Sheriff's Service of Process Fee

IC 33-37-5-15

28.00 (3)

Total Criminal Filing Fees (with service of process fee)

\$ 213.00

- * Judge determines if this fee is to be collected and/or the amount of the fee.
- (1) Collect \$.50 only if traffic offense and could be \$25.50 if exceeding the worksite speed limit or failure to merge.
- (2) If the criminal action is a misdemeanor and the defendant enters the pretrial diversion program.
- (3) The clerk that maintains jurisdiction over the case, shall collect this fee from a party requesting service of a writ, an order, a process, a notice, a tax judgment or any other paper completed by the sheriff. This fee may only be collected one time per case for pre-judgement, and one time for post-judgement. (effective 1/1/25)
- (4) However, if accused person enters into a pretrial diversion agreement under IC 33-39-1-8 the fee is \$5.
- (5) A court that adopts a local rule imposing a late payment fee may collect \$25.



FEES CONTINUED...

- REMINDERS:
 - FEES COLLECTED SHOULD BE RECEIPTED AND POSTED PROMPTLY (AT THE TIME OF THE TRANSACTION)
 - RECEIPTS SHOULD BE ISSUED FOR ALL COLLECTIONS
 - AN APPROVED OR A PRESCRIBED RECEIPT IS TO BE USED
 - PROPER INTERNAL CONTROLS SHOULD BE IN PLACE FOR HANDLING COLLECTION
 - EMPLOYEES HANDLING COLLECTIONS SHOULD BE PROPERLY BONDED (AT LEAST \$5,000)





EXAMPLE: COURT COSTS

IC 33-37-4-1 STATES: "(A) FOR EACH ACTION THAT RESULTS IN A FELONY CONVICTION UNDER IC 35-50-2 OR A MISDEMEANOR CONVICTION UNDER IC 35-50-3, THE CLERK SHALL COLLECT FROM THE DEFENDANT A CRIMINAL COSTS FEE OF ONE HUNDRED TWENTY DOLLARS (\$120)..."

EXAMPLE: COURT COSTS IC 33-37-7-4 Fees collected by clerk of circuit court; county share Sec. 4. (a) The clerk of a circuit court shall forward the county share of fees collected to the county auditor in accordance with IC 33-37-7-12(a). The auditor shall retain as the county share wenty-seven percent (27%) of the amount of fees collected under the following: (i) IC 33-37-4-1(a) (criminal costs fees). IC 33-37-7-2 Circuit court clerk's distribution of fees Sec. 2. (a) The clerk of a circuit court shall distribute semiannually to the auditor of state as the state share for deposit in the homeowner protection unit account established by IC 4-6-12-9 one hundred percent (100%) of the automated record keeping fees collected under IC 33-33-35-1-21 with respect to actions resulting in the accused person entering into a pretrial diversion program agreement under IC 33-39-1-8 or a deferral program agreement under IC 34-28-5-1 and for deposit in the state general funds seventy percent (70%) of the amount of fees collected under the following: (1) IC 33-37-4-1(a) (criminal costs fees). IC 33-37-6 Fees collected by clerk of circuit court; city or town share Sec. 6. (a) The qualified municipality share to be distributed to each city and town maintaining a law enforcement agency that prosecutes at least fifty percent (50%) of the city's or town's ordinance violations in a circuit or superior court located in the county is three percent (3%) of the amount of fees collected under the following: (1) IC 33-37-4-1(a) (criminal costs fees).
