DIPLOMA REDESIGN PROGRESS TO DATE

Listening Tour across Indiana


June 5

DIPLOMA READINESS SEALS



Enrollment- Ready Seal



Employment- Ready Seal



Enlistment-Ready Seal

To be jointly developed with and approved by the Indiana Commission for Higher Education, in conjunction with higher education institutions

Must meet the *minimum entrance* requirements for the majority of Indiana's higher education institutions

To be developed in consultation with business representatives across multiple industries

To be developed in consultation with the **Indiana National Guard**





DIPLOMA READINESS SEALS CONTINUED

- Each seal would have a defined set of required course offerings and course sequences.
- Students could earn **any of the three seals** *with either diploma* (Indiana GPS or Indiana GPS *Plus*), and may earn *more than one seal*.
 - o Ex. enrollment + employment seal
- Seals would reflect a student's unique graduation plan.
- Seals would be reflected on a student's transcript to signify a student's readiness for enrollment, employment, or enlistment leading to service.

- Increased job opportunities and job satisfaction;
- Increased job stability, including during economic downturns; and
- Greater health outcomes and a better quality of life.

IMPROVING HOOSIER LIVES THROUGH **EMPLOYMENT**

Students pursuing a career immediately after high school graduation have an opportunity to:

- **Earn money** while gaining **on-the-job experience**;
- Continue their education and increase their educational attainment, ideally with financial assistance from their employer;
- Develop career-relevant knowledge and skills, including specialized skills required for their specific career goals; and
- Grow their professional network and make connections with others in their chosen career field.

How can we ensure that students pursuing a career immediately after high school have the greatest career opportunities possible?



How do we ensure more students graduate high school with both the transferable skills needed to succeed in any career, as well as the niche skills needed to compete in Indiana's fastest growing industries?



How do we proactively engage business and industry across sectors to ensure high school expectations are preparing students for success in a 21st century economy, while also equipping more employers to provide WBL learning and related career-prep experiences?

WHAT IS COLLEGE BOARD'S NEW CAREER KICKSTART PROGRAM?

College Board's Career Kickstart (CK) program brings the best of <u>Advanced Placement (AP)</u> to courses designed for career and technical education. This new career-focused program leads to market-driven credentials and college credit for all students who want to prepare for a career, whether they are heading to two- or four- year colleges, technical school, or the workforce.

CK courses are powered by the AP features that educators value: robust teacher training, dedicated educator communities, free student resources, high-quality assessments, and the broadest national network of college credit policies.

WHAT IS COLLEGE BOARD'S NEW CAREER KICKSTART PROGRAM? CONTINUED

Features of Career Kickstart include:

- **Pathway:** CK Courses are designed so that skills taught in the courses build on each other over time, helping students develop deep understanding of the given field.
- **Applied, career-connected learning:** Classes engage students in hands-on learning experiences that connect to the real-world.
- **Co-developed with industry experts:** CK courses are co-developed with industry leaders to ensure that they are aligned with talent needs and industry-recognized credentials.
- Professional skills: CK courses teach skills (such as communication, problem solving, and collaboration)
 that are critical in the workplace.
- **Credentials:** CK courses map to industry-preferred credentials that we know can jumpstart a student's career-planning and trajectory.



WHAT IS IB'S CAREER-RELATED PROGRAMME?



The **IB's Career-related Programme (CP)** combines the rigorous academic coursework of the IB Diploma Programme with career-connected learning opportunities. The program is designed for students interested in pursuing higher education, apprenticeships, and/or employment. Participating students complete:

- Minimum of two IB Diploma Programme courses
 - Providing the academic rigor
- A core consisting of four components (personal and professional skills, service learning, reflective project, and language development)
 - Helping students develop skills/competencies for lifelong learning
- A career-related study
 - Supporting the rigor and provides practical, real-world approaches to learning

WHAT IS IB'S CAREER-RELATED PROGRAMME? CONTINUED

The Career-related Programme enables students to:

- Follow their chosen education and career pathways in life;
- Combine academic subjects with their personal and professional interests and skills;
- Engage in learning that makes a positive difference to their community;
- Think critically and creatively;
- Communicate clearly and effectively in a variety of situations;
- Work independently and in collaboration with others;
- Consider new perspectives and other points of view;
- Develop greater self-confidence and self-awareness;
- Demonstrate high levels of resilience and flexibility;
- Be internationally-minded and globally aware; and
- Apply their knowledge to real-world scenarios and situations.
