### **COVID-19 Update**

A reminder that ANY resident aged 16 and up can register for their COVID-19 vaccine. If you are old enough to be vaccinated, or if you know some one who is and may need assistance, please visit [www.ourshot.in.gov](http://www.ourshot.in.gov) to schedule the appointment today.

Mayor Hogsett and Dr. Caine continue to provide regular updates online and via local news media. Please be reminded that the Marion County Public Health Department COVID-19 Public Health Orders can be viewed [online](#). The mask mandate for Marion County is still in place, and masks must be worn in public when moving about establishments and while not eating or drinking. With infection rates and hospitalization rates on the rise once again, we need more people to get vaccinated before we can truly experience any type of herd immunity, according to Dr. Caine.

Now through June 30th, Indy residents can get rides to and from the grocery store for just \$1 dollar each way using the code: FEEDINDY when you use the Lyft ride sharing service. Simply download the Lyft app from your smart phone's app store.
